2022-23 **Color & Design.** Adjunct Instructor. *Marymount Manhattan College*. New York, New York.

This course is an introduction to the elements of the visual language and the fundamental principles of design. Using a variety of media, students explore how material, process and form combine to communicate meaning.

 A foundation class focusing which introduces students to drawing concepts. With an emphasis on observational drawing, various materials, methods and subjects are explored as a means of cultivating visual acuity. Skills and exercises include: perspective, figuration, still life and landscape. Historical and contemporary examples are presented in weekly digital slide presentations. Taught in-person and online

 A foundation class focusing on time based projects, primarily using Adobe Premiere as a video editing platform. Students cover the basics of picture taking, animation, short films, foley, and performance art to investigate concepts of change, sequencing, transformation, duration and narrative.

 A foundation class focusing on making three dimensional projects, using hand and power tools as well as 3D printing. Using basic sculptural processes, this studio course develops the student's understanding of form and space. Exploration in three-dimensions includes proportion, scale, form, materiality, surface, volume and relationship. Collaborative and individual projects will relate to the human form, functional objects and the environment with emphasis on communication, sustainability, and cultural context. Projects include research, mapping, planning, design, building and presentation as integral components. Historical and contemporary examples are presented in weekly digital slide presentations.

 For non-art majors to develop their knowledge, perception and technical facility in drawing through a variety of media. Students explore both traditional and unconventional concepts for creating successful drawings and will articulate their knowledge of the fundamental principles of drawing and of aesthetic literacy.

A structured, observation-based class focused on skill building and preparing students for subsequent independent research. With a continued emphasis on process, students explore a range of materials and techniques, gaining a deeper understanding of the tools of painting, color mixing, pigments, varied surfaces, supports and substrates, and the technical challenges of painting in oil. Through projects such as still life, landscape, the figure, abstraction and conceptual concerns, students develop personal approaches that enhance their formal and individual growth as artists.
