BREAKING BOUNDARIES:

50 YEARS OF IMAGES

A retrospective exhibition featuring the work of Mariette Pathy Allen

EXHIBITION STATEMENT

The ongoing photographic work that Mariette Pathy Allen has developed over the span of the last five decades focuses for the most part on the love, beauty, intimacy, joy, and heartache of transgender and gender-expansive communities across the globe. Her earlier work, which began in 1978, offered images of this often underrepresented community without the sensationalist lens that had been characteristic of media coverage. Through her intimate portraits of individuals, couples, and families depicted as relatable people, Allen has contributed to a humane and dignified representation of that community, and created a body of work that has become central to the evolving attitudes towards transgender, non-binary, gender-fluid, and other gender non-conforming people—in stark contrast to the thencommon notion of gender-variant individuals as freaks or social deviants. Allen's disarming modus operandi throughout her career has been to extend invitations to countless individuals to be themselves in front of her camera. In her photographs, Allen and her subjects bear witness to the profound truths of gender-nonconformity; truths she beheld since the first time she took a photograph of a transgender person in 1978 and felt she was "not looking at a man or a woman, but the essence of a human being."

Allen's first book, *Transformations: Crossdressers and Those Who Love Them* (1989), was a groundbreaking exploration and recognition of this widely overlooked and misunderstood community depicting them as partners, lovers, parents, families, and friends. Allen's 2003 book, *The Gender Frontier*, illustrates and reflects upon a changing political climate through photographs and text covering political activism, queer youth, and a range of transgender people in the United States. Since then, Allen has turned her lens to other parts of the world to photograph gender-expansive communities internationally, leading to her books *TransCuba* and *Transcendents: Spirit Mediums in Burma and Thailand*. Published in 2014, *TransCuba* documents the transgender community of Cuba during a time of increased visibility and acceptance. *Transcendents*, published three years later in 2017, provides a glimpse into the gender variant world of spirit mediums in Burma and Thailand.

Allen has been continuing her work in the United States with an ongoing series titled *Gender Expanded*, offering representations and celebrations of transgender identities, experiences, and relationships. Her work serves as an antidote now, during our current political climate that is once again changing, in ways that attempt to diminish the validity of transgender individuals and threaten their safety. Photographs from all five of Allen's projects are represented in this exhibition, tracing the progression of Allen's career spanning five decades.

TECHNICAL SPECIFICATIONS

This exhibition of 53 photographs was first exhibited at Culture Lab LIC in Queens, New York from June 1st to July 31st, 2023 and was curated by independent curator and artist Jesse Egner along with Culture Lab LIC curator Orestes Gonzalez. The work is divided under three series based on geographical location—The first, *Gender Expansive USA:* 1978-2023 (33 photographs), contains photographs taken in the United States and includes the projects *Transformations: Crossdressers and Those Who Love Them, The Gender Frontier*, and *Gender Expanded*. The other two series are for Allen's work from abroad: *TransCuba:* 2012-2019 (10 photographs), and *Transcendents: Spirit Mediums in Burma and Thailand:* 2007-2016 (10 photographs). However, any of these three series could be developed into a standalone exhibition and can contain more or less photographs as gallery space allows.

The photographs in *Gender Expansive USA* range in size from 9×12 inches to 15.25×23 inches in frames that range from 20×26 inches to 26×33 inches. Additionally, several of these photographs are original vintage dye transfer, Cibachrome, and silver gelatin prints. The photographs in *TransCuba* and *Transcendents* are all 14.5×22 inches in frames that are 23.5×30 inches. All photographs are matted and are in white wood frames.

ARTIST BIO

Mariette Pathy Allen is a photographer of transgender, genderfluid, and gender variant communities, as well as other continuous series such as *Birth and Families*, *The Face of New Jersey*, *People With Art*, *Flowers and Fantasy*, *Texas*, and *Scapes*. In 1978, on the last day of Mardi Gras in New Orleans, Allen met Vicky West, a trans woman she befriended and through whom she was first invited to Fantasia Fair, a transgender conference where she would serve as official photographer. She traveled across the US to many other transgender conferences, participated in political activism, and worked for the Transgender Tapestry magazine. She continues to pursue the work of photographing, interviewing, and advocating on behalf of gender-nonconforming people.

Allen is the author of four books that have brought visibility to transgender communities across the world including Transformations: Crossdressers and Those Who Love Them (1989), The Gender Frontier (2004), TransCuba (2014), and Transcendents: Spirit Mediums in Burma and Thailand (2017). She has made dozens of slide presentations to a variety of groups, participated in radio and television programs, and been a consultant and still photographer for films. Allen's work is included in numerous collections, both public and private, and has been exhibited internationally. Her work is being archived by Duke University's Rare Book and Manuscripts Library and the Sallie Bingham Center for Women's Studies. 
