

ERODES is a one-off book that began unintentionally in 2001, when I filmed a rave in Munich. Returning to the tape in 2020, I became preoccupied with the glitches: the moments where the image breaks apart, and memory becomes static. One corrupted frame became the basis of the entire work. Through repeated photocopying, the image gradually disintegrates, a slow erosion produced by reproduction itself. Each page is separated by carbon paper, so new, accidental prints accumulate over time through touch and pressure, even when the book is closed. it becomes a study in disappearance: a meditation on technological decay, the instability of memory, and the traces we leave on the things we handle, often without realising. Labour and touch, touch and history.
